<u>New church roster</u> The present roster of liturgical duties for the 10.30 Service comes to an end at the end of May and a new one will shortly be compiled. <u>Church open</u> The editorial in this month's Rock raises the possibility of St Peter's being open to the public for much of Saturday. The Vestry meeting last week considered appropriate means to advertise the open church. David Hoskins and the Vicar potter around the church for much of Saturday morning preparing for Sunday so we are looking for volunteers who would be prepared to give an hour of their time for the afternoon watch. Noting the recent geo-technical and engineering report on the Church, together with its recommendations and costings, Vestry resolves to seek the necessary consents from the Dunedin City Council and approvals from the Diocesan Trust Board and the Diocesan Council for the recommended work to proceed. Noting the costings in the Hanlons report Vestry resolves to immediately draw down all its units from the Diocesan Trust Board Growth Fund referred to in the AGM accounts as the St Peter's Renovation Fund in preparation for funding the earthquake strengthening and renovation of the Church. Noting the further funding required for these projects Vestry resolves to devote all of next year's grant from the D'Arcy Christopher estate to this purpose.

Noting the further funding required to finance these projects Vestry resolves to seek funding assistance from the Dunedin City Council Heritage Fund, the Lotteries Heritage Fund and the Community Trust to make up the shortfall – Fr Hugh to file the DCC Heritage Fund application, the Wardens the Lotteries Heritage Fund application and Tubby Hopkins the Community Trust application.

Vestry also approved the purchase of flags to advertise the "Church Open" initiative, subject to checks being made with the DCC about legal issues to do with the use of advertising flags. Fr Hugh and Tubby Hopkins are to seek a meeting with the manager of Strawberry Sound to negotiate about difficulties arising from the sound system
