**Some more wise words from our envelope recorder** The best form of giving to the parish is through the direct debit system. You don't have to remember to bring an envelope each Sunday, your giving continues when you are away on holiday and the reliability and predictability of this income source is a great help to the parish in planning its budget for the year.

<u>Vestry news</u> David Hoskins reported that the Miniaturists group will be installing LED lights in the hall with financial assistance from other key hall user groups. There will be a special Service at the Cathedral on Sunday 16 September at 10 am to mark the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the diocese. St Peter's will cancel the 10.30 am Service so we can all attend this. A letter was authorised to go to the DCC Heritage advisor and Heritage New Zealand conservation officer regarding a compromise offer regarding their desire to retain the crosses and chimney on the church roof. The parish is prepared to replace the crosses with light weight alternatives but is adamant that it wants the chimney down. Drainage possibilities were considered to try and stop the efflorescence occurring on the internal wall of the church by the Link entranceway.

The formerly over-churched Christchurch city centre For many years there was much Christchurch diocesan head scratching about what to do about the over concentration of St Luke's, St Michael's, St John's Latimer Square and the Cathedral in the city centre. However, the earthquakes destroyed St Luke's and St John's Latimer Square, and now that latter parish has departed en masse for the new extra-provincial diocese leaving only St Michael's and the Cardboard Cathedral. The diocese has now decided to build the new diocesan headquarters on the former St Luke's site, together with a small chapel for the St Luke's congregation. The problem is what to do with the Cardboard Cathedral when the former Cathedral is up and running, an outcome still some years away. The new stadium will be built behind it making it a very noisy venue.
