Major shakeup proposed for Christchurch Catholic parishes

Consternation and tears have greeted news of a proposed major reorganisation of Christchurch Catholic parishes from twelve to five so that there would be five super parishes called Christchurch North, West, East, South and Central. The argument is that the five super parishes will have critical mass to achieve much more and of course it would help with the priest shortage. The seven parishes slated for closure are in Mairehau, Addington, Burnside, Aranui, Beckenham, Halswell and Bryndwr. Some of these are quite modern church buildings and several are on very developable land which could realise around \$26 million. The diocese will soon announce whether the new central parish will be on the old Barbadoes Cathedral site or on a site close to the Square. There are around 11,500 regular Mass goers in Christchurch. They have until 30 August to make their views known on the reorganisation. Bishop Paul Martin will no doubt be in for some intense conversations with the flock over the next few months.

Reflecting on a decade of mission leadership The Revd Steve Maina is a Kenyan priest who has led the Church Missionary Society of New Zealand for the past decade. He is also the Bishop-elect of the Nelson diocese due to be consecrated at the end of August. He will be reflecting on the lessons and learnings of his ten years in office at CMS at a meeting at Holy Cross, St Kilda hall on Sunday 30 June from 2.30 to 4 pm. All welcome.
