<u>Lighting up the hall</u> David Hoskins reported to the last Vestry meeting that the Miniaturists group would be installing LED lights in the hall with financial assistance from other key hall user groups. This took place on Saturday. We anticipate that there will be better light levels in the hall requiring less power to make that happen.

<u>Aerials installed</u> Last Tuesday Strawberry Sound fulfilled its promise to relocate the sound system aerials to a high point in the Church in the vicinity of the bell tower entrance with a view to improving the sound quality coming from our microphones. This work was completed free of charge following on from negotiations that Tubby Hopkins and the Vicar had with Strawberry Sound.

<u>Selwyn review panel</u> The diocese has established a review panel chaired by Archbishop emeritus David Moxon to look into the issue of whether the diocese should retain ownership of Selwyn College. 50 written submissions have been received by the panel and this past week it began receiving individual spoken submissions, including the Vicar. He continues to advance the view that we should sell the College to the University. It is anticipated that the panel will not complete its work until next year.

Reflecting on a decade of mission leadership The Revd Steve Maina is a Kenyan priest who has led the Church Missionary Society of New Zealand for the past decade and is also the Bishop-elect of the Nelson diocese. He will be reflecting on the lessons and learnings of his ten years in office at CMS at a meeting at Holy Cross, St Kilda hall on Sunday 30 June from 2.30 to 4 pm. All welcome.
