Remembering Peter Cape next Sunday Peter Cape was the Curate here in the early 1950s. He went on to become a pioneer of television religious broadcasting and a doyen of New Zealand folk music with songs like She'll be Right Mate, Down the Hall on Saturday Night and The Interisland Steamer Express. He died at the early age of 59 in 1979. After a long hiatus his ashes will be interred at All Saints Church cemetery, Kaukapakapa next Sunday after a memorial Service at the church. This will be followed by a concert of his more well-known songs in Helensville organised by his son Christopher. We will remember Peter at our 10.30 am Mass.

Impending beatifications John Henry Newman, one of the founding fathers of Anglo-Catholicism and later a Catholic Cardinal is to be declared a saint on 31 October. Unusually this beatification is being hailed by both those on the right and the left of the Catholic world who both claim to see congenial elements in his theology. Anglicans also are proud of their former son and of this honour which is about to be paid to him. Another beatification coming up in the lift is that of Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, an American priest whose television show in the 1950s and 60s made him the most powerful communicator of Catholic Christianity of his time. In many ways he was the founder of the tele-evangelist church. Some of his most famous quotes are on the front cover of this morning's Pebble. From Crystal Cathedral to Catholic Cathedral For many years the Revd Robert Schuller ran his famous "Hour of Power" Service watched by millions of Americans and attended by thousands of devotees who flocked to his renowned Crystal Cathedral, which actually had no crystal in it but rather 10,000 panes of glass. His message was a mixture of the power of positive thinking and popular protestant Christianity. After his retirement his children were unsuccessful in continuing the ministry and the Cathedral filed for bankruptcy. Now the Catholic diocese of Orange county California has picked it up
