<u>Waverley news</u> A Peninsula parish parishioner meeting last Saturday decided to request that diocesan property commissioners be appointed to investigate the practicalities of and to clear the way for the eventual sale of St Nicholas, Waverley and its hall. They will also be asked to check out the practicalities of the sale of the Nissan hut/hall and land behind St Michael's, Andersons Bay. St Michael's will be the last remaining worship centre in that parish as all the others around the Peninsula have been closed and sold off in recent times.

Confused Canadian General Synod outcome The General Synod of the Canadian Anglican church met recently with gay marriage in church being the biggest agenda item. Making such a major change in the canons of their church requires a two thirds majority in each house and while that was achieved in the houses of the clergy and the laity it failed to reach that threshold in the house of bishops. Tears and loud lamentations were much in evidence, the usual display of Mediterranean behaviour that one has come to expect as the accompaniment of the defeat of progressive causes. The house of bishops then convened and declared that those dioceses that presently have church gay marriage ceremonies under the permission and blessing of their bishops would be permitted to continue doing so. A very odd result leaving one perceptive Canadian Anglican to comment, "Why bother having a Synod - why bother having a vote?" Another outcome was the election of Canada's first female Archbishop. Thinking ahead to next year's Lambeth Conference Canada will go to that Communion event in the human sexuality bad boys club along with America, Scotland and New Zealand. However, they are unlikely to receive any serious penalties because Lambeth is just what it says it is - a conference, not a Communion Council that makes binding decisions on its members. There will be much earnest debate, opining and wringing of hands but little or nothing will happen as a result.
