Christmas return of the St Kilda Brass Band Following up on a suggestion from Shane Foster, the conductor of the St Kilda Brass Band, after its highly successful recent concert here Fr Hugh and he are planning for a "Christmas Festival of Brass and Carols" here at St Peter's on Sunday 22 December at 10.30 am. This will take the place of our usual Nine Lessons and Carols. It will be a Service but with a concert edge to it. The young players in the band have usually dispersed by then as the university breaks up for the year so this will be the St Kilda brass band ensemble, the inner core of the band of a more mature age consisting of 8 brass players plus a percussionist.

Synod news Last weekend's Synod was concerned in the main with revising a number of diocesan statutes to make them congruent with the canons and to bring them up to date with revised realities. What should have been a straightforward process was complicated by a progressive minority seeking gender parity on appointments to diocesan bodies. They then upped the ante by trying to introduce gender fluidity (i.e. transgender, intersex) criteria for such appointments. A confused compromise emerged in many cases but Fr Hugh saw off an attempt to introduce such bonkers identity politics appointment criteria to the diocesan trust board on which he serves, one of the few highly functional and effective diocesan bodies. He also raised some concern points, as well as affirmations, of the revisions proposed to the Title D clergy disciplinary measure, a long overdue reform process now getting under way ahead of next year's General Synod. St Matthew's, Dunedin gave a written and verbal report on the harrowing time they have just been through as their Vicar and a large proportion of their parishioners broke away to form Hope Church, part of the extra-Provincial diocese of New Zealand. They were rewarded by both their Synod representatives being elected to next year's General Synod, thus displacing Bonnie Millar-Perry, the transgender Synod representative from the Wanaka Cromwell parish. The new diocesan chancellor Lauren Pegg is also from St Matthew's being one of their new Wardens. The progressive minority also unsuccessfully sought to oppose an affirmation of the church's traditional teaching on euthanasia.
