The St Kilda brass band ensemble, the inner core of the band of a more mature age, consists of 8 brass players plus a percussionist.

Synod of the Amazon From time to time the Pope calls together gatherings of Catholic Bishops from certain areas of the world for consultations in Rome. Many have been unremarkable and little noticed by the world's press. An exception is the upcoming Synod of the Amazon, a gathering of 300 Catholic leaders in Rome from 6 to 27 October. Pope Francis has announced two agenda items that have drawn wide attention, the need to address urgent ecological issues to save the Amazon and the possibility of ordaining mature married men from the indigenous tribes of the Amazon basin as priests, thus overcoming the grievous lack of local clergy that leaves many Catholics unable to receive communion more than four times a year. The Brazilian government, now lead by a right wing populist, has relaxed restrictions on commercial encroachments on the Amazon resulting in more burn offs than usual so that more of the rain forest than usual is going up in smoke. It has become jumpy about the possibility of critical blow back from the Synod and is keeping it closely under observation. Conservative critics of Pope Francis, particularly from North America, argue that the church's business is converting people, not ecological conservation issues, and that the church's rule on clerical celibacy is non-negotiable. That of course ignores the reality that the Maronite church of the Lebanon and the Uniate churches of Eastern Europe that are in communion with Rome are permitted married clergy, as indeed are convert Anglican clergy who are already married. A revitalized Catholic clergy presence is essential in checking the spread of Pentecostal and evangelical missionary incursions that sell a false health and prosperity gospel and that tell the Amazon Indians to abandon their indigenous culture.
