#### Fr Hugh's Opinion Page

Reflections on religious affiliation data from the recent census It is not often that I agree with Bishop Brian Tamaki about anything but his chagrin about Destiny Church membership being listed at 1,722 rather than his own claim to have 6,000 members is I think fully justified. As he pointed out the census form didn't ask if people belonged to Destiny Church and many of his people would have put down Pentecostal or Evangelical. The fact that Catholics are now the biggest denomination at 10.1% is no surprise as their numbers are buoyed up by recent immigration, particularly in Auckland. Anglicans' precipitate fall to 6.7%, down from 16.8% 18 years ago is also no surprise. The strategy of trying to blend in with the surrounding secular culture has been a disaster and the failure to think and act nationally has hampered mission initiatives where they were most required. The fact that 2.2 million New Zealanders, 48.6% of the total, now say they have no religion is a wakeup call to the churches. It also explains why governments now think that they can ignore the churches when it comes to introducing controversial legislation on issues such as abortion and euthanasia, formerly no go areas of public policy. Virtue signalling resolutions from church Synods likewise receive scant attention because politicians know they are not backed up by solid voting blocs as in former decades. 38.6% New Zealanders declare themselves to be Christian but we are not able to drill down into this figure to see to what extent it is made up of those who in opinion surveys say that they are spiritual but not religious.
