<u>St Peter's Christmas Services</u> Sunday 22 December 10.30 am Christmas Festival of Brass and Carols, Monday 23 December 11 am Anglican Eucharist at Frances Hodgkins, Christmas Eve 6 pm Eucharist at St Barnabas, 10.30 pm A candlelit Vigil of Readings and Carols and first Mass of Christmas – this is followed by a social gathering in the lounge, Christmas day 9 am 1662 Holy Communion with Carols.

<u>Kaikorai invades St Kilda's turf</u> Last Monday night a core group of the Kaikorai band played Christmas Carols in Baker St while helpers collected for the band. Of course this was what the Salvation Army band used to do at this time of the year but that seems to have ceased along with other traditional army activities like Salvation Army Officers selling the War Cry and collecting in pubs and bars on Friday nights.

Is this a Christian Church? Two Saturdays ago Ken Ferguson, a member of our 8 am congregation, was on duty as part of our "Church Open" programme that runs each Saturday fortnight. Three women came into St Peters and were given a guided church tour by Ken. Just before leaving they enquired, "Is this a Christian Church." <u>Time to make your confession</u> Advent is a penitential season in which it is entirely appropriate to make your confession before Christmas.
