End of an era at All Saints Gladstone, Invercargill The Revd Richard Johnson will retire at the end of December bringing to an end an 18 year ministry at All Saints Gladstone. An Englishman from the Lake District by origin he spent most of his life as a businessman in Zimbabwe until the increasingly repressive Mugabe regime forced him and his family to leave at short notice thereby losing everything. Arriving in Invercargill in 2001 he settled in to a long parish ministry where by hard work All Saints would become one of the strongest units in the diocese. We have been praying for his daughter Claire Christie for many years as she struggles with a degenerative kidney disease. Richard was part of an influx of clergy from Southern Africa who have done much to strengthen the New Zealand Anglican church.
