Some anticipated Anglican highlights in 2020 The General Synod of the New Zealand Anglican Church will meet in Nelson in mid-May. At this stage little is publicly known about the expected agenda although a reform of the Title D clergy disciplinary measure is expected if the task group of Diocesan Chancellors can bring their change proposals together in time. The Lambeth Conference will meet 22 July to 2 August. This is supposed to meet in a ten year cycle but this one has been delayed by a number of years as the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to persuade as many Provinces and Bishops as possible to attend. The agenda he sets and the way he presides will be a test of his considerable leadership skills. The rival event of the GAFCON (Global Anglican Futures Conference) bishops' conference will take place in Rwanda in June. This will be presided over by Archbishop Foley Beech of ACNA (Anglican Church of North America) and will be attended by the bishops of some of the largest African Provinces, and by newly consecrated New Zealand bishop Jay Behan of the Extra-Provincial diocese of New Zealand. The New Zealand Extra-Provincial diocese has twelve parishes with many young persons and young families within them, together with some energetic middle aged people. It faces three challenges - to maintain its unity (breaking away to form a purer church can become habit forming), to maintain forward momentum by continuing to grow in numbers and parishes and to institutionally sustain itself beyond just one generation of church life. Meanwhile one of the ultra-liberal Anglican Provinces has had to face up to some bracing news. A report presented to this year's Canadian General Synod shows that on present trends their church will cease to exist by 2040.
