Anglican Primates gather in Jordan The Primates of the Anglican Communion are meeting in Jordan with Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby for a low key gathering that is not expected to produce any major decision making communiques but is rather a planning and preparation session designed to make this year's Lambeth Conference of bishops as successful as possible. The location is shrewdly chosen as it is near major pilgrimage sites to do with the life and ministry of Jesus and because Jordan is seen as something of a beacon of excellence in its treatment of refugees, its commitment to religious peace within its borders and its desire for the avoidance of war between Israel and its adjacent neighbours. When the Primates had an audience with King Abdullah their meeting place was close to the place where Jesus was baptised in the Jordan, the focus of last Sunday's liturgical celebrations.

New Dean welcomed This morning Dunedin's new Dean will be liturgically welcomed to the Cathedral thus beginning his ministry there right away in this way enabling the bishop to get away to Britain where he will preside at the wedding of one of his children. The formal institution Service for the Dean with full diocesan participation will follow in February. A house has been purchased for the Curtis family in Belleknowes.
