# PARISH NEWS

Mothering Sunday In keeping with our honouring of Mothering Sunday sprigs of rosemary will be blessed and distributed at the end of the morning Services.

<u>Fellowship group</u> The Fellowship Group has decided to pause its normal cycle of meetings until the public health situation becomes clearer.

Cancellation of future church Services The Archbishops and our Bishop have decided to get ahead of future government health protection requirements by cancelling all future church Services after today's Services. This applies not just to Sunday Services but also to small mid-week Services such as the Thursday morning Eucharist and the Friday Lenten Eucharist and to the visit to the Karitane church planned for late April. It also means that the parish AGM, scheduled for next Sunday, is postponed indefinitely with the result that the present Vestry, Wardens and Synods people will remain in office. Personally I am disappointed with this decision. It is not one I would have made, however those are the directives and we must comply.

Parish contingency plan to meet this situation The Vicar and Wardens met on Thursday to draw up a contingency plan in case this scenario arose. It is as follows. Each Saturday a small team will film a St Peter's Eucharist that will then be posted on the parish website so that parishioners can view it on Sunday and make an act of spiritual communion in concert with what they see. This will consist of an introduction, the readings, the sermon, the intercessions, the Great Thanksgiving Prayer, a dismissal prayer and a blessing. Communion will be taken to parishioners in their homes on request and as pastorally required. On Sunday mornings there will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the high altar from 8 am to 11 am so that parishioners can come for times of private prayer. This will conclude at 11 am with a blessing or Benediction of the people with the Blessed Sacrament.

The Pebble and The Rock will continue to be published and made available online as usual. Anyone who needs a printed copy will be able to get one (or arrange delivery) from The Vicar.

Holy Week Services It seems unlikely that the ban on church Services will be lifted by the time Holy Week comes around. Therefore the core of the Paschal Tridium Services, The Maundy Thursday evening Service, the Good Friday Liturgy of the Passion and the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil, will also be filmed and posted on the parish website. Not every parishioner of course has access to the internet. Please go to a friend or family member who does so you can share in this essential Holy Week experience.

<u>Wardens' meeting</u> Fr Hugh will meet with the Wardens on Wednesday. Please mention to Deirdre Harris or Di Bunker any matters you want raised at that meeting.

<u>Passing of the abortion reform act</u> Little noticed in the saturation news coverage of one issue only was the passing of the decisive second reading of the abortion reform act. Attempts to amend the legislation to prevent abortion on the grounds of sex selection, i.e. the mother doesn't want that particular sex of child, or of disability or handicap failed. So very shortly we will have abortion on demand in this country, a depressing lowering of the moral capital of our nation.
