<u>This evening's reflection theme</u> This evening at Evensong and Benediction Fr Hugh will be reflecting on Callum Brown's influential book "The Death of Christian Britain: Understanding Secularisation 1800-2000." Brown challenges

the influential secularisation theory that argues that Christian churches in the west have been in a process of gradual decline since the late 18th century. Instead he argues that the churches were doing quite well up until the mid-1960s when a process of rapid decline set in due largely to the changed role of women in western society.

New episcopal biography Judy Mills, wife of a former Dean and then Bishop of Waiapu, has written a biography of Norman Lessor, Bishop of Waiapu from 1947 to 1971 and for many years Archbishop of New Zealand. It is entitled *Likely Lad: the life of Norman Lessor, Archbishop of New Zealand.* Lessor was notable for the rebuilding of Napier Cathedral in a modern style and for being at the forefront of the long and complex church union negotiations. Born in Liverpool to a humble family he was one of the last of the expatriate bishops with a strong preference being shown by electoral synods thereafter for New Zealand born bishops.
