Optimism or pessimism There is much debate about whether NZ is heading into a major recession or is making a faster than expected economic recovery. The diocesan trust board's investment advisor is in the optimist camp. He believes we have had the recession. The economy and markets went down so fast that they landed at the bottom with a thud and now have nowhere to go but up. The trillions governments have pumped into economies keep interest rates low so bonds and bank deposits are unattractive and there is nowhere to go for investment capital but into shares. Some industries are doing well, particularly in the health care sector, while others that have been hard hit, such as tourism, were due for a major reorganisation and readjustment process anyway. The danger in stock market surge situations is when they bear no relation to the productive capacity and performance of the economy. We are not in that situation, at least not yet.
