<u>St Kilda Brass Band concert postponed</u> Regrettably the current level 2 restrictions have led to the postponement of the late August St Kilda Brass Band concert here at St Peter's. It is hoped we can reschedule this for October.

<u>Uncertainty about Dunedin Diocese Synod</u> The current Level 2 restrictions have created uncertainty about whether the Dunedin Diocese Synod can proceed as planned in the second weekend of September. If meeting restrictions continue and make a face to face Synod impossible there will be a virtual Synod on that Saturday which will be confined to essential business omitting the controversial possible sale measure for Selwyn College.

Ground-breaking ceremony at Holy Trinity Avonside, Christchurch While on leave in Christchurch the Vicar took part in a ground-breaking ceremony at his former parish of Holy Trinity, Avonside being asked to splash holy water on a quadrant of the land assigned for the rebuild, which is in fact the site of the former church. Construction has now begun and is expected to take around a year. This will be a modern building incorporating the worship space and a community gathering area. The architect is Hugh Tennent, whom the Vicar used to completely renovate the interior of St Peter's, Willis St. Our parish hopes to employ his services to resolve the outstanding issues it has with local heritage officers to do with the earthquake strengthening proposals for our Church. Unordained Co-Dean of the Taranaki The diocese of Waikato is unusual in having two Cathedrals and two Deans, one in Hamilton and a pro-Cathedral in New Plymouth. In a recent move to be up with the play in the bi-cultural stakes and to show that it is fully on board with the three Tikanga structure of the New Zealand Anglican church it was decided to have Co-Deans in the Taranaki, one Pakeha and one Maori. However, what is rather extraordinary is that the Maori Dean is not ordained and is a layman who has recently made his way to the Anglican church from the Baptist church. This illustrates the growing incoherence of the three Tikanga structure of our church.
