Synod news The diocesan Synod met last Saturday in virtual mode by zoom. It confined itself to essential business such as electing the diocesan council, the diocesan nominators and passing the annual budget. The diocesan accountant warned of some challenging developments that lay ahead for parishes. National auditing requirements are now being tightened so that the relatively informal measures that some parishes use to audit the annual accounts that are brought to their AGM's will no longer suffice. In future they may well have to turn to professional accounting firms to carry out this function. The insurance industry will shortly require parishes to have their buildings professionally revalued. The diocesan council is setting some money aside to assist those parishes that will struggle to pay the cost of such a valuation. The end result of the revaluations is that insurance premiums on church buildings are sure to rise. Some parishes are dependent on the quarterly payments they receive from the diocesan trust board income fund in which their bequests are invested. At present these are paying out at 3.5% but this rate is sure to decline. The diocesan Synod will reconvene on Saturday 14 November to consider the possible sale of Selwyn College to the university. The Vicar will be moving the sell motion.
