Remembrance Day Service The date for the Remembrance Day Service has now been confirmed as Sunday 8 November. 11 November, the Armistice Day date, falls on a Wednesday and the earlier Sunday date suited the bugler. Having thoroughly covered Great War topics in previous years our attention will turn to World War 2 and in particular to the commemoration of the Battle of Britain.

All Saints and All Souls Next Sunday will be the feast of All Saints. Normally we would transfer the solemnity of All Souls to the following Sunday but that is not possible this year because of the proximity of the Remembrance Day Service. Accordingly we will have an extra celebration of the Eucharist on Monday 2 November, which is in fact the proper date for this. Usually we read out the names of those recorded in our book of Remembrance at that Service. The All Souls Eucharist will be at 12.30 in the parish lounge.

<u>Why Wednesday</u> Parishioners have enquired why our expedition to the Karitane church on 18 November is on a Wednesday instead of the usual Saturday. This is because it is easier to book in lunch arrangements at a mid-week date.

St John's Invercargill to become a modern learning centre

One of the more imposing structures in central Invercargill is St John's Invercargill, a building never quite finished but the Anglican church's answer to the Catholic basilica and the Romanesque like First Presbyterian church. Often St Peter's Curates served their second Curacy there in the midst of a large congregation. In recent years St John's fell on hard times and after prolonged negotiations it was sold to the Southern Institute of technology in 2018. SIT is both earthquake strengthening the building and changing it into a sophisticated learning centre based around digital technology. The Centre of Creative Industries will house SIT's school of music and screen arts school that covers animation, fashion technology and concept art. It will become one of the most contemporary creative sites in the country for education. This has been a happy repurposing of a prominent Dunedin diocese church. The remnant St John's congregation worships at St Luke's in Otatara with a small cluster worshipping at Iona Chapel within the Presbyterian Peacehaven rest home. The Centre of Creative Industries is expected to open in 2022
