<u>All Saints</u> Today we celebrate the feast of All Saints. Our 10.30 am Service begins with a procession around the church. Please

feel free to join in. This morning's sermon is entitled "The Perils of Saint making."

<u>All Souls day Mass</u> This will be tomorrow Monday at 12.30 in the parish lounge. The names in the book of Remembrance will be read out at this Service.

Remembrance Day Service Our Remembrance Day Service will be next Sunday. Having thoroughly covered Great War topics in previous years our attention will turn to World War 2 and in particular to the commemoration of the Battle of Britain. **Rock** This month's edition of the Rock is available at the back of the church and in the Link.

Church tree news Delta is tasked with trimming trees to keep power lines intact. Soon they will trim the two oaks on either side of the Vicarage drive way. They have offered to cut down the lacebark immediately adjacent to one of the oaks at their expense thus saving the need for the parish to pay for its subsequent trims. The Vestry has decided to accept this offer as the trunk of the lacebark has become bifurcated and because it is out of keeping with the other types of trees in its vicinity. The two oaks are protected trees and cannot be cut down. The problem is that they are now approaching the end of their lives with bits breaking off them in high winds. When they eventually fall they are likely to cause a considerable amount of damage for which the parish will be financially liable.

<u>Vicarage broadband connection</u> The copper wiring that connects the Vicarage to the internet and other communication portals has been subject to buffering and other slowdown issues in recent times. It is anticipated that Chorus will deliver a free broadband connection to 57 Baker St on Tuesday. It is hoped that this significant technology step forward will not be accompanied by the complications and temporary loss of function that sometimes go hand in hand with such upgrades. Production of the Pebble, for instance, is dependent on the smooth functioning of all the communication devices in the parish office.
