Iranian cuisine at Forbury Corner Last Monday saw the opening of "Noosh", a café offering Iranian food in addition to the usual coffee and cabinet food. The Iranian food is available on a take way basis between 5 and 7 pm, is tasty and appears to be the real thing. It is good to see the slow reopening and revitalization of hospitality venues down Hillside Rd after a long period of retail decline in our area. The opening of "Noosh" was repeatedly delayed by the DCC insisting on a raft of changes to the building on a continuing basis. Perhaps the DCC should be renamed the "Difficult City Council." **CCANZ expands north** A year ago the Confessing Church of Aotearoa New Zealand broke away from the New Zealand Anglican Church to form a parallel structure. It was mainly concentrated in the South Island and in particular in Christchurch. To be a genuinely national church it needed to expand into the North Island and now that has begun to happen. Three Auckland churches have formed and affiliated to them, the Auckland Anglican Mission, the South Auckland Anglican Mission and Abide Church. The Revd Malcolm Falloon, who has been attached to Hope Church Dunedin, is moving north with his family to lead the Auckland Anglican Mission. In addition Abide Church, Hamilton has affiliated. CCANZ has now begun to ordain its own clergy, two in the North Island and two in the South Island. Interestingly it appears that they will ordain women.
