It has been a major concern for some time now that there are many keys circulating in the community that provide access to our hall from former hall users who did not bother to hand in their keys when their hall use concluded.

Dunedin exposed Last Wednesday's front page ODT article with this title brought into sharp relief a major existential crisis facing South Dunedin. It warned that coastal properties in areas identified as being at high risk of coastal flooding or ocean inundation are likely to face very large increases in insurance premiums or the possibility that insurance companies might refuse to offer cover thus causing major knock on difficulties for property owners' mortgages. Apparently 3100 properties are at risk in Dunedin with presumably the overwhelming majority being in South Dunedin. Frustratingly no detail was offered as to where exactly the danger zone is or whether our church is in it. This observer believes that 3 things need to happen to meet this situation. Some limited managed retreat will be necessary with generous compensation offered to those asked to leave. This would only affect some properties near the coast and would not involve a wholesale withdrawal from South Dunedin. Wetlands need to be created near the coast as these have very considerable water storage capacities and are cost effective ways to deal with flooding and ocean inundation as they work with nature and not against it. Since neither the DCC nor ORC have the financial capacity nor the hydrology skills to deal with this imminent crisis it follows that there must be a central government nationwide long term strategy in place together with considerable funds set aside to implement it.
