<u>**Pray for those whose memorial occurs at this time</u>** George Hopkins, John Hamer, Thomas Robbins, Claude Morris and Stanley Hitchcox.</u> Making the church water tight Cameron roofing swung into action this past week and replaced over 30 slates on the church roof, a testament to the high winds we have had over the past year or so. St Peter's is blessed to have a church roof on such a high camber so that even when we lose slates or they shift sideways the roof does not leak. However, if left long enough water damage will surely follow. Our roof is approaching the end of its life and its replacement is a looming issue, one about which we are at loggerheads with the heritage advisors of the DCC and Heritage New Zealand. At his last speaking engagement/homily to the parish on Easter Day at Evensong and Benediction Fr Hugh will give a detailed account of the earthquake strengthening and renovation issues facing St Peter's church in the years ahead. This presentation will be filmed so it can be used to brief a future Vicar/Wardens/Vestry as they prepare to grapple with these issues.

**Parish AGM deferred until late April** The parish has received permission to defer the AGM until late April. We usually try to avoid the late March deadline as it adds unnecessary stress so close to Holy Week. It is also the case that because of the Covid lockdown we had our previous AGM very late last year. This will also give the nominators an opportunity to report on how the search for a new Vicar is going.
