The loathing of the Tamakis Brian and Hannah Tamaki have obligingly taken upon themselves the collective loathing of journalists, the commentariat and labour politicians with their much publicised exit from lockdown Auckland. The reasons for the Tamaki's' condemnation are well known and have been much publicised. To some extent though these criticisms have failed to see the real problem with the Destiny church message, the proclamation of a prosperity gospel and with it a cargo cult religion. In the words of the famous Janis Joplin song, "Lord, won't you send me a Mercedes Benz?" The real message of the gospel is closer to, "I beg your pardon, I never promised you a rose garden." The Tamakis' achievement has been to start from scratch two successful and well attended churches in Rotorua and South Auckland and to break out of being just a church for broken down Maoris by reaching out to a wider constituency. They have, however, overreached themselves at times. The satellite churches they established across New Zealand, including one meeting in the Dunedin North primary school, have mostly faded away because the franchise fee they levied was so much that Pastors either closed their churches down or declared UDI. Their attempt to get a Christian political party under way showed their naivety about the way NZ politics work. The one to watch in that partnership is Hannah who is the financial and administrative brains of the operation.
