PARISH NEWS

Renewal of baptismal vows Our 10.30 Service begins with the renewal of baptismal vows, which the Vicar will lead from the font. A procession around the church will follow. Do feel free to join in.

<u>Filmed Service</u> The Evensong and Benediction Service this evening, Fr Hugh's last Service, will be filmed as Fr Hugh will give an overview of all the earthquake and building repair

issues facing the church. This will provide a useful record for future reference when the time comes for restoration work to begin on the church.

<u>Aftermath</u> Although today is Fr Hugh's last day of ministry at St Peter's he will continue to live at the Vicarage for a further fortnight as he clears the Vicarage of all surplus possessions prior to the relocation firm uplifting his remaining household goods.

Episcopal visit The Bishop will be the celebrant and preacher at next Sunday's Services. Thereafter the interregnum priest Fr David Tannock will be preaching and presiding through April and May.

<u>Palm crosses</u> Did you receive a Palm Cross last Sunday? If you missed out on this opportunity you can find one at the back of the church.

<u>Vestry news</u> The Vestry met last Tuesday. A laptop has been purchased to facilitate the printing off of the Pebble in future. Plans were made for lay people to take over responsibility for rest home and home communions from June on. The date for the parish AGM has been set down for Sunday 2 May after the 10.30 am Mass. The Vicar farewell social events programme was discussed together with preparations for the Paschal Tridium.

<u>Phyllis Wheeler RIP</u> Members of the 10.30 am congregation may recall Phyllis Wheeler, the lady with the white stick, who would often accompany Jo Steele to church from Frances Hodgkins. Recently transferred to Radius Fulton she died there last week just short of her_100th birthday. Her funeral_will be at St Mary's, Oamaru on the 7th of April at 2 pm.

Showdown in Palmerston North The Anglican parish of All Saints, Palmerston North is engaged in a legal fight to the finish with the local Council and its heritage advisers about what is permissible in its rebuild and earthquake strengthening measures in a case that has possible landmark significance in our parish's difficulties with local heritage advisers. All Saints has been unused since 2013 because it is earthquake prone and has raised millions to put the building right but it also wants consent to remove the baptistery wall, which is the most public face of the church, and add a new glazed porch and meeting area to provide a welcoming entrance to the historic building. The heritage advisers oppose this and want the church to retain its present frontage and have perhaps have an inconspicuous side entrance instead. The parish regard raising and spending the estimated \$12 million to put the building right as a waste of money if it results in a building that did not suit the church's mission. Noting that the Council has given them an ultimatum of seven and a half years to earthquake strengthen the church the parish says it would rather demolish the building than comply with the Council's requirements. Our local Catholic parish used a similar threat, although in a more sotto voce manner, to gain permission to reroof the basilica with colour steel rather than slates, something St Peter's would also like to do. It will be fascinating and informative to see which party prevails in this landmark case.
