

From the Vicar...

One day I'd like to write a children's story of St Peter's experiences in his relationship with Jesus and his life-long journey of faith.

He was a passionate person who had definite ideas on what Jesus' ministry was about, but he struggled to put his actions with his words. He had faith to leave his family to walk the roads with the Rabbi, he was often asked to be the spokesperson for the disciples, he attempted to walk on water, build a monument and stop the inevitable. But Peter also denied his allegiance with Jesus and failed to recognise Christ on the shore at Galilea. Jesus knew these things would happen and yet Jesus told him 'to feed his sheep.', and '...be the rock for the church.' It's quite presumptuous to expect to have it all sorted and know

the reasons why.

Learning more about the personalities of the Bible and the saints that have gone before, helps us appreciate that none of us are 'good'. Christ said, 'Why do you say good. Only God in heaven is good.' Being good isn't the point. We are who we are for the role God has for us, we just need to trust in God's love and grace through the Holy Spirit. We need to learn to trust, like Peter, that we can be and are being, used in all ways and all things for the extension of God's kingdom through Christ our Lord, and Saviour.
