

From the Vicar...

We saw our first New Zealand bumblebee yesterday. It flew slowly at ten centimetres above the ground along the freshly cut grass in the backyard and disappeared into a bush. It looked like it had purpose and direction, and seemed to know its altitude limitations.

Having clear purpose and intent helps keep us directed and every choice we make has future repercussions. To quote C.S. Lewis, 'Every time you make a choice you are turning the central part of you that chooses, into something a little different than it was before. And taking your life as a whole, with all your innumerable choices, all your life long you are slowly turning this central thing into a heavenly creature or a hellish creature: either into a creature that is in harmony with God, and with other creatures, and with itself, or else into one that is in a state of war and hatred with God, and with its fellow creatures, and with itself. ' I pray we can support each other in making choices in harmony with God.
