From the Vicar

Finding a home has always had its challenges and it seems to be getting more difficult over the last few years. Dan and I moved 15 times in 14 years because of the nature of our jobs but also because we had a few houses sold while we were renting them, 4 to be exact. We'd tidy up the yard and paint a few things and then the owners would decide to make a profit on our labour. The Israelites had a similar problem. Egypt was not their home and they were being used to make the Egyptians rich. God heard their prayers and so guided them to a promised land to call home but on the way they had to be willing to trust God. There is a saying, 'Home is where the heart is.' The Israelites' hearts were fickle and they didn't love or trust God. It took the Israelites 40 years to travel a distance that should have only taken months because they wouldn't listen to God's guidance and love. In the next few years St Peter's is going to need to listen to God so that this church remains a spiritual home for those who come and share in the joy of the gospel. I pray we continue to open our hearts to God and be prepared to travel into the future as a faithful people. Natalie.
