From the Vicar

During my time in Junee C.C., I had the privilege of working with Sister Rose. She had been a prison chaplain for 23 years when I met her. Her straight forward attitude and honesty guided me through some interesting situations. Her most powerful saying was "Just love them, it's as easy and as hard as that." Love isn't easy when the person is disrespectful and is trying their best to manipulate you. Love isn't easy when the person you care for ignores you and seems to actively undermine you. We are told to love but what is love really? Firstly, we need to listen to God and humbly respect ourselves. Only when we identify God's unconditional love for us, can we truly begin to love others. Christ died for all of us, without exception. God is the source of all love, we cannot do it on our own. If someone causes you pain, take that hurt to God and leave it with Him. Their behaviour is their problem,... not yours. We should not get distracted by the behaviour of others. We need to concentrate on what we're supposed to do, knowing we won't get it right every time, either. Love only works if you are single minded about what you are meant to do and you relinquish power and expectations to God. Natalie.
