From the Vicar

This year's World Day of Prayer is being held on Friday 3rd April at 2.00 pm in Holy Cross, St Kilda. It takes place at the beginning of Lent to remind us of the Christian tradition of observing and preparing ourselves for Christ's passion and resurrection. The concept of the world day of prayer, fasting and study goes back to a small group of women in 1861. The movement grew, and after the devastation of WWI, the International World Day of Prayer was founded in 1927. Publications were prepared, summer conferences, study days and courses were made available, so that women could become informed about the lives of women and children in other parts of the world, and could study biblical foundations and vital issues related to mission work. This special day continues to be celebrated in a variety of ways. Each year a different country prepares the service. The 2023 service has been prepared by the Christians in Taiwan. I hope you can join us or pray for us, as we meet as brothers and sisters in the presence of God and pray for those things requisite for our souls and our bodies. Natalie.
