As I was scrolling through pictures for Easter, this picture struck me as poignant. A Roman soldier bending down to pick up the discarded crown of thorns. The photo is more suggestive than historically accurate. The scene would have been dirty, the crown covered in blood and hair and the soldier would probably have been sweaty after a day amongst the crowds and dust, but the message is clear. To those in power and authority, education and money, a filthy circle of thorns is litter but to those of us who know the person who wore it, it is an object of great love, grace and passion.

Jesus Christ didn't die because of us, but for us. To show us that no matter how painful, hopeless and abandoned we feel, God is with us. Emmanuel, the Christ died so that we can appreciate the future we have been born to, not this present veil of tears but, the immeasurable glory of life with God the Creator of eternity.
