From the Vicar.

The Matthew reading this week may seem rather harsh, however the concept of love and commitment is the central message of the Gospel. Jesus Christ was preparing his disciples and followers for the reality of life. The relationships in which we find ourselves will not, and cannot, provide all we need. While families are generally a gift they fall short of the relationships that God intends for us. Culturally we are expected to respect and put family members first but this isn't always possible because of free will. Personalities, opportunities and expectations influence us in many different ways and each one of us must navigate as best we can. God's call on our lives will require sacrifices and possibly cause other's feelings to be hurt. In ancient times, one needed to leave the home to go to the well and draw cold water.
