

From the Vicar.

I find Remembrance Day and ANZAC Day challenging. On one hand we are asked to remember those who have been in military engagements but also pray for peace. While these two activities aren't mutually exclusive. These dates, are but a few that identify the ongoing need to recognise that peace across the world remains elusive., despite the billions of dollars spent and millions of lives destroyed.

As a young person I remember vividly the horror and despair of the Vietnam War, being daily televised into our lounge room. My brother visited Cambodia last month and paid respect to a Cambodian friend and his family, who where butchered by the Pol Pot regime in 1975. War isn't a distant entertainment but a global tragedy that stems from distrust, greed, pain and lack of forgiveness. Today I pray for those how have hurt my family and friends, knowing that this is the only way forward.

The Collect for Remembrance Sunday God, our refuge and strength, bring near the day when wars shall cease and poverty and pain shall end, that the earth may know the peace of heaven through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
